RE: Case 16-E-0060 – Proceeding on Motion of the Commission as to the Rates, Charges, Rules and Regulations of Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. for Electric Service

Dear Secretary Burgess,

On July 2, 2018, the City of New York submitted “Comments of the City of New York Regarding the Request for Clarification and Request to Make Clarifying Revisions to its Tariff” in which the City recommended that the Commission (i) approve the Company’s proposed tariff amendments with respect to the 125 MW eligibility cap and NOx requirement, (ii) revise the Applicability language under Section C to read ““Customers taking service or planning to take service under S.C.11 and taking service or planning to do so under another Service Classification through the same service connections” (additions underlined). Similarly, the Applicability section for Options A and B should be revised to state, “to any Standby Service Customer taking service or planning to take service under S.C.s 5, 8, 9, 12 or 13 or PASNY,” and (iii) revise the data collection requirements to ensure that the Company collects DER information to the maximum extent possible.”

Consumer Power Advocates (CPA) is a coalition of not-for-profit commercial health care and educational customers in the Consolidated Edison service territory that advocates on behalf

of consumer interests before the Commission, NYISO and elsewhere. Some of CPA's members take service under SC-11 and many expect to avail themselves of the opportunities presented by Rider Q.

CPA wishes to indicate that it supports the City's comments and urges the Commission to adopt them.
